LIVERY COMPANIES

Livery companies were originally trade or craft guilds. They were established in the middle ages to represent the interests of their members within the City of London. The term livery refers to robes worn by senior members on ceremonial occasions.

Mercers were merchants who exported English woollens and imported luxury fabrics such as silks, velvets and fine linens.

Livery companies are ranked in order of ceremonial precedence, established in 1515/16. The Mercers' Company is ranked number one. Today there are 110 Companies in the City of London, many of them founded since 1945.

A Historic Venue

The Mercers' Company was formally incorporated in 1394 by a
royal Charter granted by Richard II. The Company was a trade
guild representing the interests of members who exportedbirthplace of Thomas Becket. The first Hall, completed in 1524,


MERCERS' HALL HAS SIX ROOMS LOCATED ACROSS THREE FLOORS








The Livery Hall










The Large Court Room



The Library


The warm and cosy atmosphere of the Small Court Room, which features white sycamore panelling, offers an ideal setting for more intimate events.








The Library on the second floor is suitable for meetings. Sofas and armchairs provide a comfortable area to relax during breaks. Light or cold refreshment can be served.




The Ambulatory

This bright and open space on the ground floor next to the Chapel is a perfect setting for drinks receptions.



The Ceremonial Stairs and Hallway

The grand ceremonial staircase leads from the entrance to the main hallway on the first floor. The three stained glass windows on the landing were part of a scheme designed for the second Hall by the Crace Brothers in 1880-81. After that Hall was destroyed by enemy action in 1941, the surviving glass was incorporated into the third Hall and can also be seen in the windows of the Livery Hall.


